### <u>Children – Close to the Mystery of God</u>

A number of times in the gospels Jesus spoke of the special place that children have in what he called the 'kingdom of God' In a recent reflection paper for Catholic schools Fr James McEvoy reminded us that 'every child is an icon through which the mystery of God shines'.

Every day at St Anthony's your children show us a glimpse of what God is like...through their trust, openness, joy, creativity, generosity, compassion and their ability to forgive.

They are deserving of, and have every right to, the love and protection of adults in their families, their schools, their churches, sporting clubs and all places in our wider community.

#### Children – Sharing from the Heart

Last week I purchased some new crosses and 'prayer hearts' for classes. The crosses are made from authentic wood from olive trees in Bethlehem, the Holy Land – the place of Jesus' birth! This wood is pruned from trees which have been bearing fruit ever since the times of the Romans. The tradition of making handicrafts began in the 4<sup>th</sup> century AD. Monks on pilgrimage taught the residents how to carve and the tradition has been passed ever since generation to generation. When I asked the children why they think I bought the hearts for their prayer times their responses were fascinating! One child suggested I bought them because they were cheap!!!! She understands I don't like wasting money!!

Other children shared thoughts like:

"It's a heart and so it's about love and Jesus wants us to love"

"It reminds us that God is love and God is in our hearts"

"When we think about God we think about love"

"A heart means love and we try and love everyone"

# NAPLAN

The school community would like to congratulate the Year 3 and Year 5 students for achieving good results in the 2017 NAPLAN. We had 4 students withdraw form participating in the NAPLAN by parental request.

All our Year 3 students achieved the National minimum standard or above. 53.3% of our Year 3 students received a reading score in Band 6 which has indicated that our students are skilled readers and able to apply what they read to a range of questions. The five areas assessed in the NAPLAN Test are reading, writing, spelling, punctuation & grammar and numeracy.

The Year 3 St Anthony's students results showed that reading , punctuation & grammar and maths were the areas of strength. While the Year 5 students area of strength were reading, punctuation & grammar and spelling. Our Year 5 students progress from 2015 to 2017 was 81% in reading and 72% in mathematics. These figures were calculated on the students making average to high progress from when the students were in Year 3 in 2015 to year 5 in 2017.

Once again our students have received pleasing results and the students should feel proud of their efforts.

# Road Safety

# SAPOL have sent us some road safety reminders and we will providing you with their safety tips in each newsletter for the rest of the year.

#### Sgt John and Humphrey say – Road Safety around Schools Begins with You



While we are looking forward to the warmer weather over summer, we are still likely to have the odd rainy day. Wearing bright coloured clothing is a must when walking or riding a bike to school in wet weather. On rainy days, many people look down to stop the rain from going in their eyes, but it is very important to look up when crossing roads or driveways. You may have seen some people run to get out of the rain – not necessarily a bad thing, but running near traffic can be very dangerous. Parents should constantly scan both sides of the road and take extra care on rainy days, as children will often run across the road without looking.

Generally, stopping distances in the wet are likely to be at least double the distance of that on a dry road, so things such as reducing speed, braking gently, increasing following distance and tread depth on tyres can be critical. Worn tyres are one of the most common vehicle defects in South Australia. Another issue in wet weather is fog on the inside of your windscreen. When this happens, use your air-conditioner – it works with either hot or cold air and dries the air, which clears your windscreen far more quickly.

Just like you, other parents don't want to get wet either and there can be quite some congestion around the drop-off zone or front gate of the school. Patience and courtesy are important.



# Remember the rules even when it's wet

Wet days mean more traffic, hazardous driving conditions – and **less visibility!** Use your **lights when driving**, bring an **umbrella**, **obey traffic signs**, and be prepared to **walk further than usual** to drop off and collect your child.


